PHEC Launches Community Colleges in Punjab

Punjab HEC introduces 2-year Associate Degree (equivalent to Bachelors Degree) on the semester system in market-driven subjects catering to local community and industrial needs

Keeping in view the international model of community colleges, Punjab Higher Education Commission in collaboration with Higher Education Department (HED) has launched a Pilot Program for the "Establishment of Community Colleges in Punjab". In the first phase, four colleges have been selected. Initially 2-year Associate Degree (equivalent to Bachelors Degree) on semester system basis is being offered in Commerce, IT, Media and Fine Arts.

The rationale behind the Community College Program is to produce skilled human resource for the economy and society. The traditional 2-year Bachelors Degree offered in public colleges offers limited to no marketable skills.

PHEC, realizing the incongruence of curricula with the market, economy and society, is taking steps to bridge this gap by introducing a 2-year Associate Degree on the model of community colleges of advanced countries in various emerging fields of industry to create a job-ready skilled workforce.

The existing infrastructure, equipment and teaching staff of the selected colleges will be used to launch these programs. More areas of specialization will be offered in the future such as Hotel Management, Paramedic, Nursing, Radiological Science and Public Health.

Community colleges offer high quality education with technical expertise at a low cost and in a flexible manner. The focus is on marketable and industry-driven skills to fulfill the dearth of skilled human resource in various areas of industry.

The Community Colleges Pilot Program would be the first step for providing a 2-year Associate Degree with professional specializations, modeling community colleges of US and preparing students to enter the job market.

After getting a 2-year Associate Degree from these colleges, the graduates will have a number of career prospects. They may choose to enter the local industry to earn their livelihood.

The effective skills and industry-education linkage would help integrate and flourish their career in their chosen fields.

Promoting Research Culture through Foreign Scholarship Schemes

Foreign Post-doctoral Fellowship

Incubating a competitive research culture is the need of the hour to promote an empirical understanding of theoretical concepts of knowledge. Therefore, in HEIs of Punjab, there is an exigency to germinate seeds of research culture. PHEC has realized the significance of this necessity and has taken steps for this project.

The culture of research can be aligned with industrial and technological processes taking place in various sectors of the economy.

Therefore, in the view to promote the culture of research through educational measures, PHEC has recently awarded **33** grants under the Foreign Post-Doctoral Fellowship (FPDF) program to the faculty members of public sector colleges and universities in Punjab.

This program was announced through electronic and print media in Feb 2016. The fellowships are meant to support the faculty by improving their research and assessment skills.

The awardees will join top 200 QS ranked prestigious universities in Asia, Europe, Canada, Australia, UK and USA. Some of the universities in USA include Stanford University, Purdue University, University of California Berkeley and University of Florida. The universities in UK include University of Bristol, University of Cambridge, University of Oxford, University of Cambridge, King's College London and various others.

PHEC will continue to make provisions for research grants by continuing in its relentless efforts to promote the cause of higher education in Punjab.

Foreign PhD Scholarship Program

In order to give exposure to the local teaching faculty of foreign education system of advanced countries, PHEC selected 19 faculty members for foreign PhD scholarships. This program aimed to improve the academic and research skills of teachers.

The Punjab Higher Education Commission invited applications from eligible public sector college teachers/university faculty in the Punjab for awarding Foreign PhD scholarships (initially for 3 years) in QS Top Ranking 500 universities 2015-16.


A limited number of Foreign PhD Scholarships were given in Humanities, Social Sciences and Management Sciences.

The scholarships were meant to support the faculty to improve their research and teaching skills. Fully funded scholarship covered university tuition fee, return air-fare, living stipend, cost of books, research allowance and health insurance. This cost may vary. The tuition fee was provided up to the limit of US\$ 79,440.


Chief Minister Foreign Faculty Development Program

Chief Minister Foreign Faculty Development Program is granted to eligible faculty members of public sector colleges to pursue one year Master Degree program from top ranking QS 300 foreign universities in order to improve their research skills. The program is fully funded by the Government of Punjab and PHEC is implementing this program in collaboration with the British Council. A total of **09** candidates have been awarded the scholarship this year.


Gender-wise Scholarship Distribution Data

Capacity-building through Extensive Training Series

PHEC Organized 5-day Training for Public Sector College Heads

PHEC aims to introduce best global practices in the realm of "Governance, Finance and Audit" through a comprehensive series of trainings for principals and DDOs of public sector colleges. The raison d'être of these trainings is to inculcate a strong sense of managerial capability in principals so that transparent governance practices may be put into place effectively. To make this initiative successful at

a broader level, collaborative linkages with public sector universities and colleges have been established throughout Punjab.

Seven regions of Punjab were selected and the training program was divided into seven phases. Approximately 480 principals and DDOs have been trained in 5 phases.

Trainings in Lahore Region

University of Health Sciences

The first such training workshop was held from 12th to 16th July, 2016 at the University of Health Sciences (UHS) Lahore in which principals of 150 public colleges from the districts of Lahore, Sheikupura, Nankana, Okara and Kasur attended. Chairperson PHEC Prof. Dr. Mohammad Nizamuddin and Secretary Higher Education Department Punjab (HED) Nasim Nawaz jointly chaired the inaugural ceremony.

UHS Vice Chancellor Maj Gen (R) Prof. Muhammad Aslam, Vice Chancellor University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences (UVAS) Prof. Dr. Talat Naseer Pasha and Vice Chancellor University of Education Prof. Dr. Rauf-i-Azam also participated in the ceremony.

Addressing the participants, Chairperson PHEC Prof. Dr. M. Nizamuddin said that the five-day training program series was aimed to empower the heads of public sector colleges to perform their administrative functions effectively. He lamented that there was an emphasis on rote learning in our colleges for which both the system and the teachers

were responsible. He further stressed the need for establishing a Faculty Development Institute to introduce modern methods of pedagogy to overcome this flaw in the education system.



Asian Libraries Conference 2016





PHEC to start 5-day training for college heads

A PHEC spokesperson said that PHEC chairman Dr Nizamuddin and Higher Education Department Secretary Irfan Ali would jointly chair the inaugural ceremony,

"The training will focus on governance issues and ways to deal with financial matters, Officials from the government and academia will address the workshop.
