# PHEC to Establish Staff Development Academies for Faculty of HEIs of Punjab

PHEC trained 700 teachers last year, 200 million have now been allocated for faculty development program of public sector universities & colleges: Dr. Nizamuddin

The Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) has planned to establish state-of-the-art Staff Development Academies (SDA) in Lahore, Multan and Rawalpindi to provide capacity-building training to the faculty of public sector Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) in the province. At the initial stage, it has envisaged setting up Staff Development Academies (SDAs) at the University of Education, Lahore and Bahauddin Zakariya University, Multan.

This proposal was divulged during a meeting held at the PHEC Secretariat, chaired by the Punjab Higher Education Minister Syed Raza Ali Gillani along with the Chairperson PHEC Prof. Dr. M. Nizamuddin. The meeting reviewed the progression of interventions to improve the quality of higher education in Punjab.


The Chairperson PHEC Dr. Nizamuddin informed that 200 million had been allocated for the faculty development program of public sector universities. The meeting agreed that linkages between industry and academia should be developed so that the industrial sector could benefit from universities'

innovative research. He said that the process to review the interventions to improve the quality of higher education had begun.

Last year, PHEC trained 700 teachers engaged in teaching BS program at Government colleges. It is important to note that there has been no systematic training for college teachers. It shows that there is a dire need for faculty development academies in Punjab.

Raza Gillani said that the provision of all the necessary facilities in HEIs was essential to raise academic standards in Punjab. Similarly, an institutional mechanism of career counseling centers should be established, he added. The meeting also decided to set up a Higher Education Advisory Council under the Minister to recommend proposals for the improvement of the higher education sector.

Hence, the Punjab Higher Education Commission intends to establish 'Faculty Development Academy' in Punjab by keeping in view specific objectives, Dr. Nizamuddin said.

# Road Map for Modernizing Mathematics & Science Education in Punjab

The Pakistan Alliance for Math & Science unveiled a report titled 'Powering Pakistan for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century: Roadmap to Transform Math & Science Education' at the Lahore University of Management Sciences.

The Prime Minister Muhammad Nawaz Sharif, addressing the ceremony, said that the education system in Pakistan should be restructured into activity-based instruction and be focused on establishing linkages between national progress and Math & Science education. He said his government was endeavoring to focus upon the provision of quality education to take the country forward.

### PHEC Launches Associate Degree under Community College Project

We need structural changes in HEIs to produce skilled manpower: Dr. Nizamuddin

The Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) has launched an associate degree pilot project in four public sector colleges to generate skilled manpower for the emerging modern job market. The PHEC has introduced an associate degree programme in the fields of Information Technology, Media, Finance and Textile in four colleges of Lahore, Gujranwala, Faisalabad and Multan to cater to the growing market needs for now. This programme will be launched in other public colleges of the province as well later on.

The PHEC Chairperson Dr. Mohammad Nizamuddin said, "PHEC is fully committed to improving the quality of research and academics in HEIs and for this purpose we are working in line with the standards prescribed at both the national as well as the provincial level." The PHEC has designed this programme to address the issue of unemployed graduate students as they were finding it very difficult to acquire jobs in the contemporary job market, he added.

## Directorate of Special Initiatives

The Commission is ensuring a strict compliance of the regularization criteria of academic programmes at the Higher Education Institutions of Punjab. It is relentlessly streamlining academic programmes in the Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) of Punjab with its primary focus on improving the quality of higher education. The Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) in collaboration with the Higher Education Department (HED) and the American Institute of Pakistan Studies (AIPS) has launched a pilot Community College (CC) program in Punjab.

### Programs and Curriculum -

Through the CC program, initially 2-years Bachelors (Associate Degree), following intermediate or equivalent certification, has been

offered in market-driven disciplines in the 4 colleges. The areas of studies in which the CCs program have been launched are as follows:



### Training of Principals of Community Colleges at USA-

The Principals of the two nominated colleges; Dr. Ijaz But, Principal, Govt. College Township and Mr. Syed. M. Baqir Jaffery, Principal, Govt. Civil Lines College, Multan went to Unites States of America

(USA) to visit Community Colleges in the USA and participate in a 4-weeks long program to get an indepth knowledge on how programs are being run and structured in the colleges.

### Observations of the American Model By Dr. Ijaz Butt -

According to Principal Government College Township, Lahore, Dr. Ijaz Butt, Community Colleges are established in different communities of the US. The basic spirit of the establishment of these colleges is to provide skilled education to the youth. This has been observed that the communities' colleges of Houston are providing education to the people of Houston and are being run by autonomous bodies which are organizing academic and administration affairs. The financial needs of these community colleges are being provided by the people of the communities through

the taxes, which they contribute to their States. The taxes provide for the skilled education of these communities' colleges.

In these communities' colleges, 2-year Associate Degree Programs in various disciplines are being offered to the students, which in comparison with universities' programs are cheaper. The students of these community colleges, ultimately get their credit hours transferred to the universities.

### Directorate of Special Initiatives



In Houston, around 70% students after spending a specific period ultimately go to the University of Houston for their higher education degree. They continue their Four Years BS Programs in respective faculties in these universities. This reveals that within a short period of time and with lesser fee, they are able to get a degree of higher education.

### **Establishment of Accelerator Computer Laboratories -**

Furthermore, these community colleges have very innovative pedagogical facilities. High-tech Computer Laboratories with the availability of a computer teacher are provided. The Accelerator can be defined as an immediate support in form of any academic materials. All these students are able

to get individual attention which we do not have in our educational system. This also enables the students to resolve academic issues on the spot. The students of Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry and Physics are getting benefits by these Accelerators.

### Linkage of Community Colleges with Industry in America –

These community colleges have a deep association with academia and industry. Industrial representatives and the representatives of Houston Chambers have given their input in designing syllabus and in implementation of the administrative policies of these community

colleges. These people keep on modifying the curriculum to meet the challenges of our time. After getting education, these industries offer internships to the students by paying reasonable remuneration.

### Faculty Development Programs -

These community colleges are keen in equipping the faculty. There is a regular wing which takes responsibility to train the faculty to equip them with contemporary and challenging needs of teaching and learning.

Considering the basic source of learning and teaching, Americans consider Mathematics very

important. This has been observed in these American Community Colleges that Mathematics is a compulsory subject. Mathematics has been given priority as a core subject in each discipline. Even in the education of Sociology and Social Work, the students have to learn basic Mathematics.

### Implications of American Model of Community Colleges in the Pakistani Context—

Although, it is very difficult to replicate the American Model of Community Colleges like the establishment and working of hightech Accelerator Labs, yet it is believed that if we are determined, we can follow this model to some extent in Pakistan.

The PHEC is delighted to hear from Dr. Ijaz Butt about his training session in USA with respect to the Community College project. His account of the training and other observations will be highly beneficial for this initiative and add to its allencompassing expertise as an exemplary role model.

The Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) will pilot the split PhD program at two public sector universities i.e. University of the Punjab (PU) and the Government College University (G.C.U), Lahore. The program will be executed in collaboration with the Institute of Social & Cultural Studies at the Punjab University, Lahore and the Faculty of Arts & Social Sciences at the Government College University, Lahore.

This program will infuse a new spirit of globalization of higher education within Pakistan through international linkages and collaborations with several foreign universities. It will further provide an opportunity to the foreign universities' faculty to visit Pakistan and mentor PhD course work in an alternate semester of the partner universities. Likewise, the Pakistani university scholars will have a supervisor from the

collaborating foreign university for their dissertation as an additional benefit.

The PHEC will engage auxiliary support for the mentoring of scholars through the American Institute of Pakistan Studies (AIPS) and the French national agency, Campus France, for the promotion of higher education in the region, international student services and international mobility.

The Institute of Social & Cultural Studies has already established international linkages with the Arizona State University (ASU), United States of America (USA). The Institute can manage the faculty exchange programs, scholars' mentoring and supervision for scholar's dissertation in collaboration with the ASU. The G.C.U Lahore has also established linkages with several universities in Europe and USA.

### **Why Split PhD Program:**

- To bring quality in the local PhD programs and international research practices through strengthening foreign academic collaboration.
- To provide international research expertise to our scholars in Pakistan by creating foreign and local university partnership especially in social sciences, arts and humanities.
- To get Pakistani university scholars a supervisor from the collaborating foreign university for their dissertation.
- To provide opportunity to local scholars to take up research work in the collaborating foreign universities and conduct research under the supervision of advisor/supervisor from foreign universities.

- Has completed 18 years of education (MS/M.Phil) in chosen discipline of studies.
- Has secured admission in the specific department of a university offering Split PhD scholarship.
- Has a strong research proposal relevant to the needs of Pakistan in general and/or to Punjab province specifically.
- Minimum 3.0 CGPA in MS / MPhil.

#### How to apply?

The eligible applicants should secure admission in the local universities offering Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) Split PhD Scholarship Program and apply for funding to PHEC after confirmation of their admission.

# PHEC Awards 160 International Travel Grants to Scholars of Punjab

The Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) has so far awarded 160 International Travel Grants (ITGs) to scholars in Punjab for presenting their research work at various international conferences. The 9th meeting of the International Travel Grant Reviewing Committee (ITGRC) was chaired by the PHEC Chairperson Prof. Dr. Mohammad Nizamuddin, while the Government College University (GCU) VC Prof. Dr. Hassan Amir Shah, Prof. Dr. M. He further added, "The PHEC offers International Travel Grants to public and private sector universities and public sector colleges of the province to facilitate participation of faculty members, non-teaching staff and PhD scholar in international conferences."

The applications were evaluated on a variety of parameters such as the scope of the conference, repute of the organizers, professional standing of invited keynote speakers, relevance of the conference with the applicant's professional career, relevance of the paper with the applicant's current

job and research track of the applicant in peer reviewed journals, he explained.

He further said that the grant was awarded purely on merit, which covered registration fee, airfare, accommodation charges and daily living expenditures up to a specified limit. "70 percent of the awarded money is granted in advance prior to participation in

the event in order to make the arrangements smoothly."

Additionally, the PHEC has been funding applicants for international conferences to give them an international exposure to present their research work at prestigious international forums. PHEC has

funded approximately 50 applicants so far.

A meeting was convened with all the Vice Chancellors of public sector universities and principals of public sector colleges to review the decision of the Federal Higher Education Commission (HEC) to end the two-year BA and MA programmes. The Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) had been directed by the Higher Education Punjab Minister Syed Raza Ali Gillani to produce a follow-up report to evaluate its impacts on the state of education in Punjab.

The Minister said that the two-year BA and MA programmes would only be phased-out in the province after PHEC has finalised the decision. He was of the view that any sudden decision can result

into chaotic state in colleges. Raza Ali Gilani said that restructuring was needed in the college education system. He added that it was not possible for Punjab to end the existing system within a year or two in a large number of colleges and replace it with a new one in such a short span of time.

It was not possible to launch a four-year BS programme at every college of the province and the decision would be taken on a "case-to-case" basis. "We will consult the vice chancellors, private sector colleges, principals of public colleges and all stakeholders before submitting the findings." The PHEC would devise a workable plan that would not harm the education system in Punjab and especially students.

## B- Proposal for Development of Indigenous Research Database (IRD)

Applications are invited to design state-of-the art Indigenous Research Database (IRD) that should include:

- A Search Engine that will be openly available to all students, staff and faculty members of universities to cater their research demands.
- Full Text Database for indigenous research repository where librarians or research administrators of the university could upload meta-data of research such as journals/research articles/conference papers, books, chapters, thesis, and patents published by faculty members, students or researchers affiliated with Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) of Punjab.

### Eligibility Criteria

- 1. The Principal Investigator (PI) of proposed research project has to be a full-time regular faculty member holding a PhD, either on BPS/ TTS or on contract not less than the project life in public sector HEIs of Punjab.
- 2. Period of execution of the research project should not be exceeding 12 months.
- $3. \qquad \text{Maximum funding for a Research Proposal may be up to 03 million}.$
- 4. PI cannot submit more than one (01) research proposal.
- . Applications may be considered ineligible if;
  - a) Incomplete
  - b) Not filed in prescribed proforma
  - c) Not received by Academics & Research (A&R) Division of PHEC on or before the closing date.
  - Application forms are not signed/countersigned/endorsed by head of institution, vice chancellor/Rector/Director of HEIs.
  - e) CV of PI is not attached.
  - f) Report generated by Turnitin is not attached.
