# PHEC Launches "Capacity Building of Library Professionals" Project

Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) has launched the first ever "Capacity Building of Library Professionals" project in Punjab under which library professionals from public sector universities and institutes will be trained in various professional skills, related to communication, leadership, and ICTs. Workshops and specialized training sessions will be conducted in

various districts under this flagship program of PHEC. The maiden two-day training workshop was organized at Main Library University of The Punjab on "Communication and Leadership Skills", during March 30-31, 2018. Chairperson PHEC Prof. Dr. Mohammad

Nizamuddin graced the inaugural ceremony as chief guest. Vice Chancellor PU, Prof. Dr. Zakriya Zakir, Vice Chancellor Govt. Sadiq College for Women University Bahawalpur, Prof. Dr. Talat Afza, Vice Chancellor MNS-UET, Multan Dr. Amir Ijaz, Ex-VC GCU Dr. Khaleeq ur Rehman, Secretary Archive Punjab Mr. Tahir Yousaf,

Director General PHEC Dr. Shahid Soroya, Chief Librarian PU Dr. Haroon Usmani and library heads of different public sector universities and organizations participated in the inaugural session.

The day-1 sessions focused, specifically, on honing the communication skills of the library professionals and imparted training on varied topics which included;

art and culture of communication, decision making, presentation skills and innovative practices in the library profession. The day-2 was dedicated to developing the leadership competencies of the library professionals. Eminent professors of the field delivered lectures on various dimensions of leadership and management.

Addressing the inaugural session, Prof. Dr. Mohammad Nizamuddin urged on the roll of libraries and said that there should be focus on building an effective information management system in libraries.

Dr. Nizamuddin said that networking of libraries could enhance the reader's access to the shared resources and save their time. "We need to upgrade these

> centers of knowledge management to promote a reading and dialogue culture" he added. "There should be separate rooms for discussion in each library to encourage student-teacher interaction, debates and discussion on

varied topics" he suggested.

Highlighting the prospects of the workshop, Dr. Nizam said that the training was more than a capacity building activity; it was also a platform for discussion to figure out the ways to make our libraries innovative, reader friendly and a center for excellence.

"We all are here to discuss how we can go ahead in this field", he said.

He also highlighted the various initiatives taken by PHEC to ameliorate the quality of higher education and research in the province. "We have launched first ever Indigenous Post-doctoral Scholarship program in the province to maximize the career opportunities for those who are unable to grab the opportunities abroad," Dr. Nizam said. "We are offering Split-PhD Scholarships; International Travel Grants; we are also launching international travel grants for students as well", he added.

Vice Chancellor PU Dr. Zakriya Zakir, stressing the role of library professionals in the production and dissemination of scientific knowledge, opined that the scientific disciplines, in this globalized era, were being merged; professional boundaries across subjects were being diminished, we needed trained library professionals to cater the information needs of the different tiers of society. "We have the best scientists, but, due to poor communication mechanism, their scientific knowledge is not being disseminated properly; the role of a trained librarian is important in this context,"he said.

Addressing the concluding session Chairperson PHEC Dr. Nizamuddin emphasized the innovative approach to cater the information needs of students. "The reading habits of the students are rapidly changing due to the information and communication technologies (ICTs). The interest of our students is shifting towards e-braries; library professionals must abreast with these modern trends to best serve the knowledge-diggers and the concept of "cybraries" should be strengthened" he said. "Our libraries should serve as places for intellectual catharsis; discussions be encouraged for which dedicated rooms with multimedia facilities be there in each library" he added

Souvenirs and certificates were also distributed among the attendees of the training workshop.





## PHEC in Collaboration with GCU, Organizes Condolence Reference on Munno Bhai

A condolence reference was organized on February 14th, 2018 at the Government College University Lahore under the auspices of Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) to pay tribute to the services of eminent drama writer, columnist and poet Munir Ahmed Qureshi, popularly known as Munno Bhai.

Noted poet Amjad Islam Amjad, Art's Professor Ms. Salima Hashmi, playwright Asghar Nadeem Saeed, veteran human rights activist Mr. I.A. Rehman, columnist Tahir Sarwar Mir, GCU Lahore's Vice Chancellor Prof. Dr. Hassan Amir Shah, PHEC Chairperson Prof. Dr. Mohammad Nizamuddin, and close relatives and friends of Munno Bhai addressed the condolence reference held at the Bukhari Auditorium.

Highlighting unique qualities of Munno Bhai's life, I.A. Rehman described him as a person endowed with a rare knack to observe life and socio-political issues, which helped him write columns imbued with wisdom.

He pointed out that comprehending the literary and political writings of Munno Bhai in its true spirit requires decades of research and an unswerving quest for knowledge.

While cherishing his long friendship with Munno Bhai, famous drama writer Amjad Islam Amjad termed Munno Bhai's representation of art very inventive in its depiction of ideas. He presented harsh social realities in a humorous yet insightful way. "He was a master of soft-criticism and using this art he exposed different societal fissures of society," he added.

The Chairperson PHEC Prof. Dr. Mohammad Nizamuddin paid a rich tribute to the philanthropic services

extended by Munno Bhai to mitigate the affliction of children suffering from Thalassemia and pledged to propagate his mission. "We will preserve his legacy and will continue his mission", he said.

Paying a tribute to Munno Bhai, Prof Hassan Amir Shah said that Munno Bhai must be a role model for the young journalists and writers. "He never tried to misuse his influence, rather used it for welfare of Thalassemia and Haemophilia in Pakistan," he concluded.

Asghar Nadeem Syed said that Munno Bhai was the most loved person in his contemporary literary circle. His dramas like "Sona Chandi" provided a window to the viewers to understand the sufferings a middle class family.

Salima Hashmi reminisced about Munnu Bhai's friendship with her husband Shoaib Hashmi and father Faiz Ahmed Faiz. Paying tribute to him, Hashmi said that Munno Bhai was among a rare breed of humanists who had empathy for common man.





VCs from 11 Universities Attend Roundtable Discussion Hosted by PHEC and USAID on Higher Education Solutions Network Program

Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) and the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) jointly organized a roundtable conference of the vice chancellors. The discussion focused on USAID's Higher Education Solutions Network (HESN). Vice Chancellors and Rectors attended it from 11 leading public and private sector universities in Punjab. The Chairperson PHEC Prof. Dr. Mohammad Nizamuddin chaired the session. The Provincial Director USAID Lea Swanson and Deputy Director Innovation & Partnership Unit Kanwal Bokharey represented USAID.

Among the participants were,

Government College University Faisalabad, Government College University Lahore, Fatima Jinnah Medical University Lahore, Khawaja Farid University of Engineering and IT RYK, Lahore College for Women University, University of Agriculture Faisalabad, University of Central Punjab, University of Education, University of Management and Technology, University of the Punjab, and University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences.

Participants learned about the USAID HESN program, a partnership between USAID and seven top U.S. universities, designed to channel the ingenuity of university students, researchers, and faculty towards global development. HESN has supported Development Labs at these U.S. universities to engage students, researchers and faculty in innovating scientific and technological approaches to the world's most

challenging development problems. "Through this program we hope to build partnerships with local universities to identify solutions to development challenges faced by Punjab that are efficient, cost-effective, accessible, and sustainable," said Ms. Swanson.

The Chairperson PHEC Prof. Dr. Mohammad Nizamuddin emphasized the importance of research on development issues in order to address the challenges faced by Punjab. He added, "I hope that collaborations between universities in Punjab and the USAID would be further explored as a result of this roundtable."



The Vice Chancellors and Rectors shared ideas of how their institutions could collaborate through HESN and suggested new areas that can be explored via this program.



## Punjab HEC and Pink Ribbon Pakistan Sign MoU to Spread Breast Cancer Awareness

The Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) and Pink Ribbon, Pakistan (PRC) signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for Breast Cancer Awareness Campaign in the Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) of the Punjab. Prof. Dr. Mohammad Nizamuddin Chairperson, PHEC and Mr. Omer Aftab, CEO, Pink Ribbon Pakistan signed the agreement. Senior PHEC and PRC officials attended the ceremony.

Through this MoU, PHEC will facilitate PRC in reaching out to its recognized public and private sector HEIs for creating widespread awareness on breast cancer incidence among Pakistani women, its impact on the life of the sufferer, and the detection of warning signs for an early diagnosis. PHEC will extend R&D, academic and technical support to PRC for breast cancer awareness through the provision of

human resource, facilities and outreach in partnership with HEIs in Punjab. Informational workshops and training sessions would be conducted, joint research projects on different aspects of cancer would be encouraged and institutions will be engaged to include breast cancer awareness section in relevant courses to support PRC.

Speaking on the occasion Chairperson PHEC remarked, "Breast cancer is a big social issue which needs immediate action. HEIs can play a critical role in spreading awareness about this disease and PHEC is committed to providing meaningful support to the success of this campaign by helping build these partnerships".

CEO Pink Ribbon, Mr. Aftab appreciated PHEC's efforts in supporting the cause of breast cancer awareness. He said that PRC is a self-

sustained organization, creating awareness among people about breast cancer in Pakistan since past 14 years. "Almost 40,000 women die each year in Pakistan due to breast cancer.

We strive to significantly reduce breast cancer mortality in the country by creating widespread awareness through community engagement on prevention, early detection and increased access to treatment. Currently, Pink Ribbon is in the process of setting up Pakistan's 1st Dedicated Breast Cancer Hospital to provide the best of facilities and environment to the patients"he added.

PHEC and Pink Ribbon will form a working group for assessment and formulation of an action plan for next five years.



## PHEC Extends its Support to ITU for #ThinkFest

Under its goal to support collaborative efforts towards promoting a critical thinking and deliberations over the implications of important issues at both local and global levels, PHEC extended its support to Information Technology University (ITU) to jointly organize a two-day literary festival the "Afkar-e-Taza ThinkFest" which highlighted history, culture and the current global

political debate.

#ThinkFest featured more than 35 talks as well

as an art exhibition,

another exhibition focused on the 1947 Partition, screenings of documentaries and a few discussions in a smaller, more intimate setting. Day 1 started with Dr. Umar Saif (ITU) and Dr. Nizamuddin (PHEC) giving opening remarks. The festival brought together distinguished academics, writers, poets, artists, analysts, and performers from all over the world. The keynotes speakers included Nobel Peace laureate, Tawakkol Karman and former Chairman of the Conservative Party, UK, Rt. Hon. Baroness Sayeeda Warsi.

Speaking about an urgent need to uphold human rights in the face of increasing inequality, racism and hatred, Tawakkol Karman Yemini, a Nobel Peace Prize Laureate, likened all dictators to

terrorists, she said that dictatorships hindered the w a y o f peaceful change. "In the Muslim world, there is

no bigger terrorist than a dictator as they always block the means of peaceful change and create misunderstandings about Islam," she said. "There is a need to demonstrate the true spirit of Islam, a nonviolent and peaceful religion, through tolerance, rule of law and love," she remarked.

Baroness Sayeeda Warsi called for



upholding principles in politics and other spheres of life to eliminate the current trend of hypocrisy in Muslim societies. Lamenting that the Muslims in Western societies were demanding

rights, which in their countries of origin were being denied to the minorities, she said this hypocritical attitude would not serve any purpose. Stressing that the people should learn to agree to disagree, Ms Warsi, the chairperson of the Conservative Party of England, said, "My faith is about who I'm and not about who you are".

ITU Vice Chancellor Dr. Umar Saif, in his opening remarks highlighted the role of democracy for a country. "We must question where we are going and what we can do in our personal capacity to put our country on the path of democracy for establishing an enlightened and

progressive society through profound, deep and delicate exercise to contribute to narrative and counter narrative. Thinkers and intellectuals should determine and articulate during the discourse to set the goals for the country."

The Chairperson Punjab Higher Education Commission Prof. Dr.

Mohammad Nizammuddin urged upon all the universities of the province to develop a culture of discussion and debate as initiated by the Information Technology University. "We needed to promote culture, research and dialogue and to talk

more about history, politics and arts. No research is complete without academic linkages with other institutions across the globe,"Dr. Nizamuddin maintained.

#### PHEC Holds 9<sup>th</sup> Meeting of Foreign Post-doc Fellowship Committee



In order to keep abreast its scholars with the latest global trends in their academic fields and sharpen their research skills, Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) is offering various foreign scholarships and fellowship opportunities to the faculty members of public sector colleges and universities. Foreign Postdoctoral fellowship is one such capacity building initiative by the PHEC, through which the eligible aspirants undergo a rigorous selection process

and successful ones are offered 9-12 months fellowship in top 300 universities according to the QS World University Rankings 2018. The fellowships are fully funded which include university bench fee, return airfare, living stipend, research allowance and health insurance.

The 9th meeting of the Post-doc Committee held on March 14, 2018, to select the fellows for the second phase. The meeting was chaired by Chairperson PHEC Prof. Dr. Mohammad Nizamuddin. More than a hundred applications were scrutinized to fill the 40 slots.

The selection process has been completed and the award letters are being issued after fulfilling all formalities. In the first phase, a total of 55 faculty members were awarded post-doc fellowships to pursue their research activities in the top-ranked universities of the world.



The Punjab Higher Education Commission organized a lecture and panel discussion on "American Foreign Policy in the Age of Trump and its implications for Pakistan" to encourage dialogue among the academia and students.

Pakistan needs to make rational decisions regarding its foreign policy after the Trump statement about Pakistan. Pakistan and United States' interests are interdependent so there should not be any hasty decisions. This was said by Chairperson PHEC) Prof. Dr. Mohammad Nizamuddin.

Renowned Professor and President of American Institute of Pakistan Studies (AIPS) Dr. Farhat Haq, VC GCU Lahore Dr. Hassan Amir Shah, VC UoE Lahore Dr. Rauf-e-Azam, VC Govt Sadiq College for Women University, Bahawalpur, Dr. Talat Afzal, political analyst Salman Abid, and Dr. Kamran Asdar Ali were among the panellists. Mr. Ajmal Jami, renowned journalist was the moderator.

Delivering the keynote speech, Dr.

Farhat Haq while commenting on the Trump policy for South Asia, especially Pakistan, said, "Trump's policy is reflective of his obsession coupled with his notions of ethnocentrism". She added that Trump's behaviour is proving to be dysfunctional for US relations with its allies.

Ms. Haq further said that there were voices within the US policy makers and common masses that regarded his policy infantile and against the interests of United States.

She urged to create a pool of social scientists and humanists to discuss the wider implications of Trump's policy for the world.

The Vice Chancellor GCU Prof. Dr. Hassan Amir Shah said that there were many voices within the United States, which considered Trump's statement against Pakistan as inappropriate. "People in US' policy corridors, as we hear from the media, are criticizing Trump policy and recognizing the role of Pakistan in the war against terrorism," Dr Shah said.

Addressing the event, the Chairperson PHEC Prof. Dr. Mohammad Nizamuddin urged that a rational approach should be adopted while reacting to the statement of the US President. "The interests of the two countries have long been associated with each other, they have huge strategic stakes, trade relations, and are allies on war against terrorism," Dr. Nizamuddin emphasized.

He added that ground realities must be considered, an irresponsible move could cost us economically. Dr. Nizam proposed, in collaboration with American Institute of Pakistan Studies (AIPS), a Centre for Research and Policy Development in Pakistan to address socio-political issues.



Discussing the options to counter the Trump policy against Pakistan, political analyst Salman Abid emphasized on the adoption of policies to ensure economic stability curtailing civil-military trust deficit, sustained foreign policy rather than a reactionary approach, and strengthening of diplomacy and think

tanks. "We need to strengthen our ties with our neighbours, instead of an outrageous policy, we should think on pragmatic and symbiotic lines", he added.

Vice Chancellor GSCWU, Dr Talat Afzal also spoke at the event. This event was

organized by the Media & Publications Department of the Punjab Higher Education Commission. Deans attended it and faculty members of Lahore based universities, DGs and senior PHEC officers, about 200 students from 7 universities and a large number of public.





Planning and Development (P&D) department of PHEC is responsible for providing guidance for the planning process and to ensure the development needs of the PHEC as well as public sector universities of the Punjab. It also oversees the development projects of higher education sector funded through Annual Development Program (ADP) and Government of the Punjab. The P&D department is also maintaining the key statistics of public and private sector HEIs in Punjab.

#### **Major P&D Activities Performed by PHEC**

# **Expansion of Community Colleges Project in Punjab**

Punjab Higher Education Commission, (PHEC) in collaboration with Higher Education Department (HED), launched a pilot Community Colleges Pilot Program (CCPP) in Pakistan's Punjab province. A development scheme has been reflected in ADP 2017-18 with an allocation of Rs. 20.00 million. P&D Department successfully prepared a PC-I of the scheme amounting Rs. 96.228 million and submitted to HED. The scheme was approved by DDSC in its meeting held on December 26, 2017 at a total cost of Rs. 96.228 million. The administrative approval was issued on February 02, 2018 for 36 months implementation period. P&D Department has initiated the release process of the scheme and requested HED for release of allocated amount.

#### Preparation and Submission of PC-II Regarding Promotion of Science Education

To address the problems of Science education and cope with the global challenges in this field, a development scheme has been reflected in ADP 2017-18 with an allocation of Rs. 50.00 million to conduct the feasibility study for promotion of Science education in

the Province. P&D Department has successfully prepared a PC-II of the scheme amounting Rs. 50.000 million and submitted to HED in November, 2017. Approval process of the scheme has been started and Pre-PDWP meeting of the scheme was held on January 04, 2018.

### Inauguration of Punjab Tianjin University of Technology Lahore

As per the directions of Chief Minister Punjab, Planning & Development Department of PHEC has worked closely with TEVTA for establishment of Technical University in Lahore in collaboration with Tianjin University of Technology, China. The inauguration ceremony was held on 23rd day of March 2018. The Chief Minister of

Punjab was the chief guest of the ceremony. He appreciated the efforts of all the stakeholders to materialize the vision of developing Pakistan's first everTechnology university.





PHEC Envisages for Up-gradation of GCT Rasul College into Technology University

Planning and Development department of PHEC is working as the focal point for up-gradation of Government College of Technology (GCT), Rasul into "Technology University, Rasul" at Mandi Bahauddin. Summary of the university has already been approved by the Chief Minister, Punjab.

P&D department of PHEC is closely collaborating with TEVTA, Industries

Department, UET Lahore and with GCT Rasul in preparation of Act of the university, proposed disciplines of the university and other documents. In this regard P&D Department arranged various meetings with all the stakeholders of the university.

P&D Department has prepared an Act of the University and forwarded to Industries, Commerce & Investment Department for further processing and approval.

A development scheme (PC-I) of the University amounting to Rs. 2,165.192 million has also been prepared and forwarded to TEVTA, Punjab for approval of the scheme in February 2018.

#### PHEC Conducts Meetings and Onsite Visits to Proposed New Varsities

Besides provision of quality education at par with global standards, PHEC has also a focus on maximizing the learning avenues and easing access to higher education in the province. For this purpose, PHEC envisages establishing various new universities:

i.The University of Khushab by upgrading the University of Education subcampus at Jauharabad and PMAS-Arid Agriculture University sub-campus at Khushab. ii.Sub-Campus of the University of Gujrat at Lalamusa by merging the Government Degree College, Lalamusa and Government I.D. Janjua College for Women, Lalamusa.

Planning & Development department of PHEC has drafted the Charter / Act of the proposed "University of Khushab" as per the Provincial Government criteria and forwarded it to Secretary HED in February 2018.

Similarly, for Sub-Campus of the University of Gujrat, a team comprising of PHEC and HED officials conducted an onsite visit of Government Degree College, Lalamusa and Government I.D Janjua College for Women, Lalamusa on March 28, 2018, to ascertain the present situation of both the colleges.





PHEC Organizes 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Multan Literary Festival at Multan

Punjab Higher Education Commission with the collaboration of Inter University Consortium for the Promotion of Social Sciences, Bahauddin Zakariya University Multan, National Book Foundation Pakistan, Radio Pakistan, Multan Tea House, Multan Arts Council, Academy of Letters Islamabad, Multan Chamber of Commerce, Muhammad Nawaz Sharif Agriculture University Multan, University of Education Multan campus, and other leading literary organizations organized a two-day annual festival named "Second Multan Literary Festival" on 21-22nd February, 2018.

Inaugurating the literary festival Chairperson PHEC Prof. Dr. Mohammad Nizamuddin urged the need of organizing such festivals on monthly basis. He added that if the education

institutions were unable in providing literary festival activities to youth, they could get involved in negative activities. He assured that the PHEC would continue its support to higher education institutions in holding such activities in future to promote curricular activities in universities. He congratulated the organizers for successful holding of this annual mega event.

Speaking on the occasion BZU vice chancellor Prof. Dr. Tahir Amin said there was a need to strengthen culture on strong footings, "The prime objective of holding the second consecutive Literary Festival is transferring Multan's ancient history, culture and traditions to the next generations" he added. He said the second MLF provided an opportunity to local writers, poets, intellectuals, calligraphers to introduce their work among youth.

The second Multan Literary Festival attracted the youth with rich centuries' old art, culture and literature of Multan, one of the oldest city of world. Session with the young women writers

PHEC Disburses 47 International Travel Grants (ITGs) from Jan-March

PHEC is striving to enhance quality of higher education in Punjab. Various initiatives have been taken by PHEC in last 2 years. One of the major initiatives is the launch of International Travel Grant (ITG) Program.

ITGs provide opportunities to our students, faculty members and other academic staff to present their research work at various international forums all around the world. These grants are not just about academics, it is much more than presenting research findings in a conference. ITGs foster collaborations and encourage the applicants for indulging in research activities.

The International Travel Grant is an acknowledgement of the research work done by our faculty members/PhD scholars and it provides more avenues and further opportunities for expanding the area of research in new directions. These grants are also hugely important for promoting the healthy competition among our researchers. Researchers visit other countries and get to know

different culture, language, food etc. This international exposure also provides networking opportunities with like-minded people.

Punjab HEC awards ITGs every month. ITG program has been successfully running since 2016. Till date PHEC has

granted over 300 ITGs. The application for ITG is evaluated by an International Travel Grant Reviewing Committee. Each application is thoroughly reviewed before a decision is made on that application.

Various parameter are considered including scope of the conference, repute of the organizers, professional standing of invited resource persons and keynote speakers, relevance of the conference with the applicant's professional career, relevance of the

paper with current job description of the applicant, previous presentations in foreign conferences/seminars and research/publication track of the applicant in peer reviewed journals. ITGs are fully funded. These include airfare, registration fee, accommodation

charges and daily allowance as per PHEC rules and policies. PHEC has also taken the initiative of granting 70% of the awarded money in advance so that the scholar can have all predeparture arrangements smoothly.

PHEC has conducted three meetings of the International Travel Grant Reviewing Committee from Jan to March 2018. A total 47 travel grants have been awarded in this period. The awardees have presented their research work in different countries including Malaysia, Turkey, South Africa, England, Scotland, Spain, France, USA, Canada and Australia, Austria, Canada, Singapore, France, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Ireland, Russia, Spain, Croatia, Sweden, Italy, Germany, South Africa, Morocco.



Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) is determined to promote a culture of research in the province through patronizing seminars, workshops and conference by higher education institutions (HEIs) of Punjab. For this purpose, it is funding generously: for international conference

a funding of up to 1.000 million is granted whereas a support of upto Rs. .02 million is provided for national events.

PHEC has funded 14 national and international level conferences and workshops during January-March,

2018. These events provide students with opportunities to interact with the local and international experts, academicians and scholars of their fields, share the knowledge, and improve their understanding about the latest research methodologies and theoretical boundaries of their fields.
