

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

During the fiscal year 2022-23, Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) made significant efforts to fulfil its entrusted responsibilities. Throughout the year, the Punjab Higher Education Commission convened three Commission meetings to discuss and make significant decisions.

When comparing the development (ODP) budget's expenditure to the previous year, there was an increase from PKR 32.537 million in 2021-22 to PKR 41.587 million in 2022-23. Similarly, when comparing the non-development (recurring) budget's expenditure to the previous year, there was also an increase from PKR 144.177 million in 2021-22 to PKR 149. 147 million in 2022-23.

The Punjab Higher Education Commission provided Rs. 26.82 million for International Travel Grants (ITG's) to faculty members and PhD scholars to participate in various international conferences, seminars, symposiums, and workshops so that they can present their research work at International forums. A total of 77 applicants were selected across 7 meetings for these grants. The selected applicants consisted of 53 males and 24 females, all of whom were presenting their research to different continents. Notably, the distribution of applicants: 2 for Africa, 7 for Australia & New Zealand, 16 for America, 6 for Canada, 19 for Asia, 12 for Europe, and 15 for the UK, in the field of Natural Sciences, Engineering and Technology, Social Sciences & Humanities.

The International Post-Doctoral Scholarship Program, provided by the PHEC, has convened two meetings and granted 17 scholarships totaling Rs. 49.74 million. Additionally, the International Research Support Fellowship (IRSF) Program, with three organized meetings, has allocated 17 scholarships amounting to Rs. 19.11 million. The Commission also supported funding to hold conferences, seminars, and symposiums in Punjab, through 3 meetings, awarded Rs. PKR 14.10. million to 33 Public and Private Sector Universities.

Punjab Innovation and Research Challenge Award (PIRCA) was granted to: UVAS, Lahore 6 grants totalling Rs. 44.500 million, GCU, Faisalabad 2 grants totalling Rs. 14 million, GCU, Lahore 3 grants totaling Rs. 22 million, UET, Lahore 5 grants totalling Rs. 29.5 million, Punjab University, Lahore 3 grants totaling Rs. 21 million, ITU, Lahore 1 grant totalling Rs. 9 million, UET, Taxila 2 grants totalling Rs. 12.5 million, UHS, Lahore 1 grant totalling Rs. 8.5 million, University of Okara 1 grant totalling Rs. 4.0 million, and BZU, Multan 1 grant totalling Rs. 7.0 million. The mid-term review of these projects involved onsite visits to different universities, resulting in specific observations that were compiled and presented to the PHEC Chairperson. The Commission, during its 29th meeting, recommended measures to maintain project quality, which were diligently implemented.

The Planning and Development (P&D) Department of PHEC has put forth several development project proposals for the PHEC. Among these projects, one initiative titled "Establishment of Youth Counselling Centers" is currently in progress. Additionally, the P&D Department of PHEC has successfully obtained funding under the Other Development Program (ODP) for various PHEC initiatives. During the year 2022-23, the government of Punjab allocated a total of Rs. 5,019.796 million for the development portfolio of Higher Education in Punjab. This allocation was distributed among twenty-four approved development projects, with a project cost of Rs. 18212.11 million and an allocation of Rs. 4837.582 million. There were also four unapproved projects with a project cost of Rs. 5083.66 million and an allocation of Rs. 182.214 million. Furthermore, under ODP budget an amount of Rs. 50 million has been allocated for PHEC. In total an amount of Rs. 5,069.796 million has been allocated in FY 2022-23 having total cost of Rs. 23,345.768 million.

The P&D department of the PHEC has successfully accomplished various other tasks, including the preparation and processing of Project Concept-Implementation (PC-Is) for universities in Punjab.

The P&D department have also prepared and evaluated feasibility/concept papers for the establishment of new universities. In addition, the department has completed the preparation of the Public Sector Development Program (PSDP) for the year 2022-23, as well as conducted a progress review of the projects included in the PSDP for that year. Furthermore, the department has prepared the Annual Development Budget for PHEC in 2023-24 and the Annual Development Budget for universities in 2023-24. P&D department also processed and completed feasibility report of MNS University of Agriculture Multan campus at Khanewal, a feasibility report for a sub-campus of Women University Faisalabad, a feasibility report for the upgradation of Government Graduate College of Science, Faisalabad to university rank, a feasibility report for the establishment of Indus University in district Rajanpur, and a feasibility report for the establishment of the University of Muzaffargarh. The P&D department has also reviewed the PC-Is of universities for submission to the Central Development Working Party (CDWP) and the Executive Committee of the National Economic Council (ECNEC). The Chairperson PHEC participated PDWP and CDWP meetings for approvals and schemes in Planning & Development Board, Punjab and Planning Commission, Islamabad.

During the specified period, the PHEC has been involved in various activities in collaboration with Universities and Institutes. These include processing of 15 cases for new programs, with 4 cases from universities and 1 case from an institute. Additionally, 2 cases for the approval of sub-campuses have been granted, both from universities. Moreover, 9 cases for granting affiliations by private sector universities have

been processed, with 2 cases from universities. PHEC has also processed 21 cases for the grant of new charters, with 12 cases from universities and 9 cases from institutes. Furthermore, there have been 5 PHEC Scrutiny & Evaluation Committee Meetings, 8 onsite evaluations (5 involving universities and 3 involving institutes), and 3 Accreditation Committee meetings. PHEC has forwarded 2 new program cases (1 from a university and 1 from an institute) and 1 case for the approval of a sub-campus (university-specific) to the Higher Education Department (HED). Moreover, 3 new cases for the grant of a charter have been handled. In total, there were 69 cases, with 30 cases from universities and 14 cases from institutes.

In terms of capacity building and faculty development, the Training Directorate of PHEC conducted a total of 13 training sessions with 686 participants during the fiscal year 2022-23. These included three training sessions for college faculty with 165 participants, two training sessions for university faculty with 120 participants, one training session for PHEC staff with 15 participants, and seven training sessions for university management with 386 participants. Additionally, the Directorate achieved a successful execution of the All Punjab Universities Innovation Expo 2022 on November 15, 2022. The event featured over 700 projects received, of which 259 projects from 37 universities were finalized and displayed. The winners of the expo received an award money of Rs. 100,000/- while the runner-up project received Rs. 50,000/-. The primary objective of the event was to promote and encourage universities to engage in applied research activities.

The PHEC is continuously dedicated to improve the quality of education in Punjab. To achieve this, the commission has presented an innovative proposal for Reforms and Restructuring of Public Sector Colleges. The primary objective of the Proposal for Reforms and Restructuring of Public Sector Colleges is to enhance education quality, faculty development, and student career opportunities in Punjab. This proposal seeks to empower public sector colleges, creating an environment that promotes learning and research, ultimately contributing to the province's knowledge economy.

Furthermore, the PHEC has played a successful role in collaborating and organizing the conference titled "Paradigm Shift in Higher Education - Hackathon Planning for Future." In the light of decisions made at the Conference, seven Consortiums comprising of worthy vice chancellors were established i.e. Governance& Finance: Challenges & Sharing Good Practices, Climate Change, Environment & Pollution, Entrepreneurship, Character Building, Drugs & Narcotics, Women Empowerment, Promotion of Technologies & Technology Intensive Solution: Energy, Food Security and Current Trends in Health Education and Education and Science Diplomacy for preparing

policy papers for the government. The steering committee led by Professor Dr. Shahid Munir, the Chairperson PHEC, oversees progress, conducts review meetings, and consolidates the Consortiums' work into a comprehensive report. These initiatives aim to shape the future of higher education and foster positive advancements in the field. Honorable Chancellor / Governor Punjab chaired many meetings of each consortium. We are thankful for his continued support and patronage.

PHEC has also patronized various programs and events, including the Rector Conference organized by Association of Private Sector Universities of Pakistan (APSUP), the 2nd Vice Chancellors' Conference "The Challenges of Academic Governance, Achieving Excellence and Equity in Higher Education" organized by the University of Home Economics and BARGAD, as well as the SEE Pakistan Expo 2022 organized by APSUP.

Moreover, PHEC has accomplished several milestones, which include the successful visit of the PHEC Chairperson as part of the Pak-UK Education Gateway Program, fostering academia-industry collaborations and linkages at both national and international levels, organizing the 1st International Students Convention on Embracing Global Diversity and Knowledge Exchange, conducting the leadership and management program for the Vice-Chancellors and maintaining a commendable journey of PHEC's Quarterly Newsletter in Higher Education.

Regarding Syndicates and Boards of Governors (BoGs), a total of 31 syndicate meetings and 8 BoG meetings were attended and contributed for better decision making. Similarly, commission representatives participated in Finance and Planning Committee meetings of different universities. The Chairperson participated in 33 conferences as keynote speaker or Chief Guest, many panel discussions, Convocations, Seminars, Workshops and Exhibitions etc. Two stakeholder consultation meetings pertaining to education matters have been held with the Vice Chancellors of Punjab's universities.

We are dedicated to elevate PHEC to unprecedented levels of excellence as per vision of Honourable Chief Minister Punjab and driving a substantial, positive transformation in the field of higher education in the future. Insha'Allah.

INTRODUCTION

During the fiscal year 2022-2023, the Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) made significant strides in various areas, demonstrating its dedication to improving the quality and accessibility of higher education in Punjab, Pakistan. The commission efficiently managed its governance and operations while overseeing a range of initiatives aimed at elevating the educational landscape. Comprising dedicated members, the commission played essential roles in guiding its activities. Regular commission meetings facilitated strategic planning and decision-making. The annual report highlights Punjab's universities' notable achievements in global ranking. Prudent budget management maintained financial stability, enabling effective planning and development initiatives.

The Human Resource Development sector thrived with programs like International Travel Grants, the Punjab Innovation and Research Challenge Award, and the International Post-Doctoral Scholarship Program, promoting research and academic growth. Capacity building and faculty development remained central, promoting academic excellence. The establishment of the Rehnumai Markaz aimed to provide guidance to students in their career choices. Forward-thinking events such as the Higher Education Hackathon and the All Punjab Universities Innovation Expo promoted innovation and entrepreneurship. The international arena witnessed active participation, with Prof. Dr. Shahid Munir's visit to the UK enhancing educational ties. An International Students' Convention encouraged cultural exchange and global networking, while leadership and management training programs enhanced the capabilities of Vice-Chancellors.

The Punjab Higher Education Commission collaborated with the Higher Education Commission and Vice Chancellors to conduct a comprehensive review of the current recruitment process for senior teaching positions in public

sector universities in Punjab. This review aimed to enhance competitiveness, transparency, objectivity, and impartiality in the recruitment process. After consulting with Vice Chancellors and considering their suggestions and insights, a set of recommendations has been meticulously prepared for the Honorable Chancellor / Governor's esteemed consideration.

The Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) meticulously reviewed over applications, received for the positions of Vice Chancellor at 24 universities in Punjab. The Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) collaborated with the Youth Engagement Services (YES) Network Pakistan to host a transformative competition that encouraged both intra-level and inter-level student participation in the province. The Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) and the Association of Private Sector Universities Pakistan (APSUP) jointly organized "SEE Pakistan 2022," an exceptional initiative designed to bridge the gap between academia and industry. Notably, discussions were held regarding the challenges and opportunities of the 2% Minority Quota in Higher Education.

The PHEC's commitment to bridging academia and industry was clearly evident through various collaborations and partnerships that facilitated the practical application of knowledge. Engagements with foreign delegates, Syndicates/BoGs meetings, and a wide array of conferences, webinars, and panel discussions facilitated the exchange of knowledge. Quarterly newsletters chronicled PHEC's journey, while proposals for the reform of public sector colleges showcased forward-looking institutional development strategies. All these initiatives underscore the PHEC's dedication to enhancing Punjab's higher education landscape through innovation, internationalization, and strategic partnerships.

GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

As per "THE PUNJAB HIGHER EDUCATION COMMISSION ACT 2014 (Act 1 of 2015)"

The Establishment of the Commission:

- (1) The Government shall, by notification in the official Gazette, establish a Commission to be called Punjab Higher Education Commission.
- (2) The Commission shall be a body corporate having perpetual succession and a common seal with powers, subject to the provisions of this Act, to acquire hold and dispose of property and shall, by the said name, may sue or be sued.
- (3) The headquarters of the Commission shall be at Lahore and it may set up its sub-offices at such place or places as it may deem fit.

Powers and Functions of the Commission

The Section 10 of the Punjab Higher Education Commission ACT 2014 (Act I of 2015) empowers PHEC to:

For purposes of promotion of higher education, research and development and for bringing provincial higher education institutions at par with national and international standards, the Commission may:

- a) Coordinate with Higher Education Commission in a result oriented manner;
- Formulate guidelines and recommend policies in line with national standards prepared by the Higher Education Commission under which public and private institutions may be opened and operated in the Province;
- Prescribe guidelines and conditions under which institutions, other than universities and degree awarding institutions, may offer qualifications in the higher education sector;
- Cause monitoring and evaluation of the performance of the institutions and carry out accreditation of institutions including their sub-campuses, out posts, faculties, departments and disciplines through Accreditation Committee;
- e) Provide guidelines to ensure good governance and management of institutions to maintain high standards of higher education in the Puniah:
- f) Assist and advise the Government in quality enhancement and quality assurance of colleges:
- g) Cause third party performance audit of higher education institutions and furnish a copy of the results to the concerned body for corrective measures and follow up;
- Cause ranking of the higher education institutions of the Punjab;
- Submit to the Government precise grant in aid requirements of the institutions;
- j) Allocate funds to public sector institutions out of bulk financial provision received from the

- Government and other sources for such purpose on performance and need basis;
- k) Advise Institutions in raising funds from sources other than the Government:
- Support in creating of linkages between institutions and industry as well as national and international organizations that support research and development in the higher education;
- m) Facilitate the introduction of educational and training programs that meet the needs of the market and promote the study in every field of national and international importance in the institutions:
- Ensure imparting marketable education and skills in the institutions and promote selfemployment through entrepreneurship and small and medium enterprises;
- Advise institutions to ensure a proper balance between teaching and research;
- Undertake various faculty development programs for improving the quality of teaching and research in the institutions;
- q) Develop guidelines and facilitate the implementation of a system of quality assurance of institutions, based on the standards developed by the Higher Education Commission;
- Encourage, support and facilitate training programs, workshops and symposia at provincial and regional levels in public and private sector institutions;
- Promote formal links between institutions to make the most effective use of expertize and specialized equipment and promote provincial, national and international linkages with respect to knowledge sharing, collaborative research, personnel exchange and cost sharing;
- Take measures, including allocation of funds, for award of fellowships, scholarships, travel and research grants;
- Establish endowment funds for higher education with contributions from the Government as well as non-governmental national and international sources:
- W) Collect such information and statistics on higher education and institutions as it may deem fit:
- Set up various committees consisting of provincial, national and international experts to advise the Commission on its affairs;
- y) Advise the institutions on framing of subordinate legislation; and
- z) Perform such other functions as may be prescribed or as may be incidental to the discharging of the above functions or as may be assigned to it by the Government.

OVERVIEW OF THE PRESENT STATE OF HIGHER EDUCATION


Punjab, the province with the highest population of over **120 million** residents, boasts a vast educational landscape. There are more than **800** public sector colleges and over 1600 private sector colleges in the region. Practically all divisions are served by more than **100** public and private sector colleges. Moreover, the province houses approximately **400** technical and vocational colleges/institutes/centres in the public sector.

The total enrolment in public sector Associate and Graduate colleges stands at around **700,000** students, with a faculty of approximately **17,000**, resulting in a ratio of 1 faculty member for every **41** students. Additionally, there are about **80,000** students enrolled in technical and vocational institutes. Regrettably, there are substantial vacancies in the education system, with nearly **8,000** positions of Lecturers and Assistant Professors, as well as **350** positions of Principals remaining unfilled in public sector colleges.

Contrasting the public sector, the private sector colleges have an impressively high enrolment, nearly quadrupling that of the public sector.










BUDGET & FINANCE





PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT

1. Introduction

Planning & Development Department of PHEC have been entrusted with the responsibility of coordination within PHEC viz a viz. devising their developmental needs, assigning priority and coordination with other organizations, for developing new and strengthening existing academic and research programs, tapping funding opportunities in respect thereof and other tasks assigned by the competent authority from time to time. P&D department directly reports to the Chairman as well as Chief Operating Officer while Director P&D is heading the team. The roles, responsibilities and a brief description of the accomplishments of different functional units of P&D Department are given below:

2. Roles and Responsibilities

P&D Department has the major role of assessing needs for developmental needs of Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) as well for the Public Sector Universities in Punjab Province, devising strategies to fulfill these needs, identifying and preparing development projects, liaison within PHEC and outside for getting the approval of these development projects from different fora, managing Institution's share of the ADP allocation, preparing cash plans, work plans, and revision of PC-Is. P&D department of PHEC is also responsible for preparation of Feasibility Reports for establishment of new Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) in Public Sector. Development budget of the universities which is being processed by Higher Education Commission (HEC), Islamabad, P&D Department of PHEC also plays its role for optimal utilization of funds and allocations of funds to the projects.

3. Accomplishments:


P&D Department has prepared various development project proposals for PHEC against which one project "Establishment of Youth Counseling Centers" is ongoing. In addition to these projects, P&D Department has also successfully secured ODP funding for various initiatives of PHEC. a) Development Budget Allocation (FY 2022-23)

Planning & Development department of PHEC in consultation with other stakeholders has prepared and finalized various budget proposals for the development budget of higher education in FY 2022-23. In this regard various meetings have been convened and after thorough deliberations, Government of Punjab has allocated Rs. 5,019.796 million for the development portfolio of Higher Education of the Punjab against Twenty-Eight (28) Development Projects and an amount of Rs. 50.000 million against Other Development Program (ODP) of PHEC in ADP 2022-23. 





Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) offers International Travel Grants (ITG's) to encourage and facilitate participation of faculty members, non- teaching staff and PhD scholars in international conference/seminar/symposium/workshop. The applications are evaluated on a number of parameters, for example, scope of the conference, repute of the organizers, professional standing of invited resource persons and keynote speakers, relevance of the conference with the applicant's professional career, relevance of the paper with current job description of the applicant and research/publication track of the applicant in peerreviewed journals. A review committee comprised of highly qualified academics meets once a month to evaluate each application. Grants are awarded purely on merit and cover the registration fee of the event, airfare, accommodation charges, and daily living expenditures up to a specified limit. In June, 2022 to June, 2023, PHEC awarded 77 international travel grants.




ITG: Distribution in College and University Sector




ITG: Distribution Region-Wise







PUNJAB INNOVATION AND RESEARCH CHALLENGE AWARD (PIRCA)

The Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) initiated the Punjab Research Fund to promote research and innovation in various sectors of the economy. Under the Punjab Innovation & Research Challenge Award (PIRCA), PHEC invited research proposals across various domains that influence economic growth and align with Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). After receiving 561 proposals, PHEC awarded research grants of Rs. 172 million to 25 approved projects from different universities. A committee was constituted to evaluate the progress of these projects, and specific observations were noted during onsite visits. The commission recommended additional measures to uphold project quality, which were implemented, and universities responded positively to the conveyed decisions. The committee is preparing a final report to be submitted to the Chairperson of PHEC after concluding its assessment.




TRAINING DEPARTMENT

ACCREDITATION

ACCREDITATION WING

The Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) has the responsibility, as per Section 10 (d), to monitor and evaluate institutional performance and conduct accreditation assessments of various educational institutions, including their sub-campuses, outposts, faculties, directorates, and disciplines. The Accreditation Committee, with legal status Under Section 12 (2), provides recommendations to the commission on matters such as granting charters, adding new faculties, opening sub-campuses, granting affiliations to private sector institutions, monitoring inspection and visitation into affairs of institutions. PHEC's Accreditation Wing actively contributes to the improvement of education quality in the province and is involved in various activities to fulfil its role:

Addition of New Faculties/Departments/Programs

Accreditation Wing of PHEC processed 18 cases for addition/approval of department of 05 private sector universities/institutes in the light of norms/criteria of Government of the Punjab, 2006.

Approval of Sub-Campuses

Accreditation Wing of PHEC processed 02 cases of private sector universities for approval of sub-campuses in the light of norms/criteria of Government of the Punjab, 2006.

Grant of Affiliation by Private Sector Universities

Accreditation Wing of PHEC processed 9 cases of private sector universities for grant of affiliations to other educational institution as per Criteria/Guidelines for affiliation by private sector universities/degree awarding institutes, 2021.

Grant of Charters to Proposed Private Sector Universities / Institutes

During this period, Accreditation Wing processed 21 cases of sponsors of private sector HEIs for grant of charter of universities and institutes.

PHEC Scrutiny & Evaluation Committee Meetings

During the said period, Accreditation Wing facilitated and conducted 05 meetings of PHEC Scrutiny & Evaluation Committee in which various cases for grant of charters were discussed and the Committee recommended to make visits of the private sector HEIs for consideration of the Accreditation Committee.

Onsite Evaluations of Sub-Committees of Accreditation Committee

The Sub-Committees conducted 20 visits/onsite evaluations of private sector universities/institutes and submitted evaluation reports for consideration of the Accreditation Committee.

Accreditation Committee Meetings

During the said period, Accreditation Wing facilitated and conducted 03 meetings of Accreditation Committee in which various cases regarding approval of programs, grant of charters, and issues pertaining to opening of Sub-Campuses were discussed.



Cases Forwarded To HED

In the light of recommendations of Accreditation Committee and Commission, PHEC has forwarded 06 cases including 02 cases for approval of departments, 01 case for approval of sub-campus and 03 cases for grant of charter of private sector HEIs to the Higher Education Department for further processing.

Progress on Other Matters

Accreditation Wing of PHEC dealt with various complaints filed by the students of the private sector universities/institutes to the Honourable Ombudsman and NAB etc. Further, the Accreditation Wing of PHEC refrained the various private sector universities for advertising admissions to unapproved programs and directed them not to advertise admission to such programs that are not approved in their charters. Furthermore, the Accreditation Wing advised the private sector universities/institutes to complete their accreditation process if they had obtained their charters from private member bills. Furthermore, the Accreditation Wing of PHEC has displayed a list of approved programs of private sector universities on its website for the guidance of students/parents to avoid taking admission in unapproved programs.

Proposal for Reforms and Restructuring of Public Sector Colleges in Punjab

- & The Punjab Higher Education Commission has put forward a comprehensive proposal with the objective of transforming and reorganizing public sector colleges in Punjab to overcome the challenges they currently face. The proposal primarily revolves around designating these colleges as constituent colleges of district or divisional universities. By doing so, the colleges would gain access to various benefits, leading to an overall improvement in their performance and services.
- & One of the significant advantages of this plan is the enhanced access to resources. As constituent colleges of larger universities, they can tap into a more extensive pool of academic and infra-structural resources. This includes access to well-equipped libraries, research facilities, advanced laboratories, and modern technology. The availability of these resources can significantly elevate the overall educational experience for both students and faculty.
- & Collaboration with industries is another crucial aspect of the proposal. By being part of larger universities, these colleges can establish stronger ties with industries in their respective regions. This collaboration can lead to internship opportunities for students, exposure to real-world challenges, and even research collaborations with industries. This connection between academia and industry ensures that the education provided aligns better with the demands of the job market, increasing employability prospects for graduates.
- & Moreover, the proposal highlights the importance of research opportunities for colleges. Being integrated into district or divisional universities, these colleges can actively participate in research projects and receive funding for their own research initiatives. This emphasis on research can foster a culture of innovation and intellectual growth within the colleges.
- & Faculty development is another critical aspect of the plan. With access to more resources, faculty members can benefit from professional development programs,

- workshops, and seminars. This investment in faculty development can lead to more competent and motivated educators who, in turn, can deliver high-quality education to students.
- & The proposal lays out a well-structured implementation plan. It starts with a pilot phase involving six colleges, which allows for a gradual rollout and fine-tuning of the framework. Once the pilot phase proves successful, the plan will be expanded to include all affiliated colleges. This approach ensures a smooth transition and reduces the risk of any major disruptions.
- & Importantly, the proposal acknowledges the importance of stakeholder consultation. Involving various stakeholders such as college administrators, faculty members, students, and relevant government authorities is essential for a successful implementation. Their input and feedback can help tailor the plan to suit the specific needs and challenges of each college.
- & The plan also addresses legal and regulatory aspects, recognizing that institutional changes may require adjustments to existing policies and regulations. Ensuring compliance with these legal requirements is crucial to avoid any potential obstacles.
- & Resource allocation is a vital component of the proposal. While transforming colleges into constituent colleges of larger universities can offer numerous benefits, it also requires adequate funding to achieve the desired outcomes. Proper allocation and management of resources are essential to ensure the plan's success.
- & Monitoring and evaluation mechanisms are proposed to gauge the plan's effectiveness continuously. Regular assessments will help identify any shortcomings or areas that require improvement, enabling the necessary adjustments to be made promptly.
- & The ultimate goal of this proposal is to elevate the quality of education, faculty development, and career prospects for students in Punjab. By empowering public sector colleges, the plan aims to foster an environment conducive to learning and research, which will contribute

Dialogue on Challenges and Opportunities of 2% Minority Quota in Higher Education

On February 28, 2023, the Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) in collaboration with the Bargad Organization for Youth Development hosted a seminar titled "Dialogue on Challenges and Opportunities of 2% Minority Quota in Higher Education". This event took place at the Arfa Software Technology Park in Lahore and brought together stakeholders, including Directors and In-charge of admission offices from both public and private sector universities in Punjab. The seminar aimed to create a platform for discussions and deliberations on the challenges and opportunities associated with implementing the 2% minority allocation in higher education institutions across Pakistan.

Preparation of Selection Criteria for Statutory Positions of Public Sector Universities of Puniab

Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC), in consultation with the universities has prepared the revised Selection Criteria for Statutory Positions of Public Sector Universities of Punjab.

The committee thoroughly discussed various aspects of the selection criteria including age, qualification, and experience for contract or deputation appointment on the statutory positions and made the recommendations.

Standardization of Formation of Panel of Foreign and Local Referee for Evaluation of Application Dossiers of Candidates for the Posts of Associate Professor and Professors in Public Sector Universities in Punjab

The Hon'ble Chancellor/Governor has desired that the Punjab Higher Education Commission, in consultation with the Higher Education Commission, Islamabad and Vice Chancellors should review the existing mechanism to bring competitiveness, transparency, objectivity and impartiality in recruitment on senior teaching positions in the public sector universities in the Punjab.

Based on the suggestions and deliberations with the vice Chancellors, the following recommendations have been submitted

- I. A standard list, not less than 20, of subject-wise experts with the consent to evaluate the research dossiers of the applicants, may be compiled and duly approved by the university's statutory bodies, including Board of Faculty, Board of Studies, Academic Council, and Syndicate. The list will be presented to the Vice Chancellor, who will select foreign experts randomly on a case-by-case basis. The list of referees will not be formulated for each advertisement, but rather will remain with the Vice Chancellor's office for a minimum of 2.5 years. It can be updated by the statutory bodies after 2.5 years.
- II. In the case of a foreign referee, the marks should be split between the Selection Board and the Foreign Reviewers. The former should be given a weightage of 30%, while the latter should be given a weightage of 70%.
- III. The government should request the State Bank of Pakistan to review its regulations to facilitate universities for their payments to foreign reviewers in foreign currency.
- IV. A standard proforma for declaration of conflict of interest is needed to be developed by the universities and would be forwarded to the supervisors along with the applicants' dossiers, clearly stating that the reviewer does not have any relationship with the applicant in terms of supervisor, co-supervisor, co-author, co-project investigator, etc.
- V. A rubric based proforma, approved by the relevant statutory body, should also be developed and sent to the reviewers to assess research productivity, and quality of each applicant. The reviewer must have to provide a list of applicants ranked in order, as well as the reason or justification for his or her ranking.
- VI. Selection Board will evaluate the candidate on the basis of knowledge of the subject, communication skills, and attitude of the candidates.


